Faith Matters 8- Jesus Matters

We don't want God's will for our lives as much as we want his <u>stamp of approval</u> on our will.

Jesus gives history a <u>context</u>, poetry an object of <u>affection</u> and prophesy a fulfillment.

(in bulletin) In the past God spoke to our ancestors through the prophets at many times and in various ways, 2 but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, and through whom also he made the universe. 3 The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact representation of his being, sustaining all things by his powerful word. After he had provided purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty in heaven. Hebrews 1:1-3

22 All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: 23 "The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel" (which means "God with us"). Matthew 1:22-23

14 So he (Joseph) got up, took the child and his mother during the night and left for Egypt, 15 where he stayed until the death of Herod. And so was fulfilled what the Lord had said through the prophet: "Out of Egypt I called my son." Matthew 2:14-15

21 So he (Joseph) got up, took the child and his mother and went to the land of Israel. 22 But when he heard that Archelaus was reigning in Judea in place of his father Herod, he was afraid to go there. Having been warned in a dream, he withdrew to the district of Galilee, 23 and he went and lived in a town called Nazareth. So was fulfilled what was said through the prophets, that he would be called a Nazarene. Matthew 2:21-23

"Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfill them. Matthew 5:17

To see Jesus only as our <u>ticket</u> to eternity fails to afford Him the full weight of His <u>eternal</u> Glory.

16 For in him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; all things have been created through him <u>and for him.</u> Colossians 1:16

In the same way that Jesus changed the way we viewed the past, he now changes the way we view the present and the future.

Jesus humbly died to make a <u>purification</u> for sin but He also rose from the grave to <u>reign</u> forever more.

If we trust that Jesus is the <u>messiah</u>, then we trust that we are not.
