13 "Enter through the narrow gate. For wide is the gate and broad is the road that leads to destruction, and many enter through it. 14 But small is the gate and narrow the road that leads to life, and only a few find it. Matthew 7:13-14

The most critical decision of our life is whether we will choose Jesus and his way or a path of our own.

12 So in everything, do to others what you would have them do to you, Matthew 7:12
