



Compassion Sunday

I am excited to announce that on Sunday, April 26th we will be joining nearly 2,500 other churches across the country to participate in Compassion Sunday. A couple of weeks ago John Fisher came to me and talked to me about our church potentially participating in this event and for me it was a no-brainer. Molly, the girls, and I have been sponsoring a child through Compassion for several years now. Her name is Lidya Samson Lafunga and she is from Tanzania. Our entire family has enjoyed seeing Lidya grow through the pictures they send and the letters she writes.

Compassion Sunday is one way that we as a church can speak up for children in poverty. Compassion Sunday has been inspiring churches to put their faith into action for 25 years now and in that time more than 200,000 children have been released from poverty. Compassion considers poverty to be the lack of things such as healthcare, education, food and shelter, but they also know that poverty goes much deeper than purely physical needs. Children living in poverty believe in Satan's lie that they don't matter. Compassion goes deeper than meeting physical needs and introduces them to a loving Savior who died that they may have eternal life in His name.

Compassion's Mission:

To release children from their spiritual, economic, social and physical poverty and enable them to become responsible fulfilled Christian adults.



They have been doing this for over 60 years. On Compassion Sunday, there will be a presentation about the work of Compassion throughout the world as well as the opportunity for individuals and families to financially sponsor children and help rescue them from the effects of extreme poverty. Men's Discipleship

Uncommon

I would venture to say if I were to ask a room full of guys if they knew who Christian authors Erwin McManus or Francis Chan is, I would see only a few hands. This is substantially lower compared to asking the guys if they knew who Tony Dungy, or my favorite coach Mike Ditka, were.

As most of you know, I've led a men's prayer group on Thursday evenings at 7 PM. Over the past four or five years the group has met, we have seen some amazing things through the power of prayer.

A couple weeks ago at the meeting it happened to be just one other person and me. We began to brainstorm ideas on how we could grow the group and see more men getting involved. We decided it would be too expensive to offer food at the prayer meeting (because we all know if you want men to be somewhere, tell him there will be food offered). What we did come up with was changing the focus of the group to a discipleship group. We will still have a time of prayer, but our focus will be on growing as disciples, growing our faith through discussion and Bible study. I wanted to find a study geared toward men, keeping in mind that some men are not avid readers. I came across Tony Dungy's "Uncommon: Finding Your Path to Significance," a men's Bible Study which looks at the following:

1. Strengthening Your Core
2. Loving Your Family
3. Lifting Up Your Friends and Others
4. Living to Your Full Potential
5. Finding a Mission that Matters
6. Having Influence Over Image
7. Living Out Your Faith

If you'd like to grow in any of those areas, please join me, starting Thursdays in May, 7 PM, for our men's discipleship group.
