Thoughts from our Senior Pastor: Why?

I was recently thinking about how people view their relationship to their church. I came to a conclusion that people view their relationship with their church in one of two ways. Either they see their church as an “institutional” part of their life or they see it as a “transformational” part of their life.

Our consumer mentality and top-down government mindset has driven many people into the institutional mindset. *The church is where I receive services. The church is where I go to for my needs. I go to this church as long as it is meeting my personal needs. Furthermore, I will keep voting this church into office by my attendance as long as it agrees with my needs. When a better candidate better comes along that offers better services, then I will cast my vote with it.*

Someone with an institutional mindset will often see the services of the church as another potential social agency to be leveraged. When this happens, people often stay close enough to the church to not feel bad when they need to ask something of it but far enough away that the church won't ask anything of them.



Others who may see the church as institutional may be incredibly committed, both in serving and in giving. The problem is that they are often doing those things to win the approval of others or because you are “supposed to.” There is no joy in “because you are supposed to.” Others are simply paying into the system so that when they have need or want things to go their way, they have banked an adequate amount of “church capital” to be able to ask that things go their way. They would like to see an eventual return on their investment.

I have recently begun reading a book entitled ASK WHY FIRST. So one of the biggest questions I have is “Why do people come to this church?” and “Why should people come to this church?” In the coming weeks and months, I am going to continue to be asking a lot of “Why?” questions to myself, to the church and about the church.

People who see the church as “transformational” come to church as an extension of their

deep and growing relationship with Jesus Christ. Church is one more place where they are able to express their love and gratitude to Jesus Christ by serving others, singing His praises, learning from His word, and giving generously. Church is not the *extent* of their relationship with Jesus Christ it is simply one more *extension* of it.

As the leadership of The Well, we are going to begin to ask a lot more of you as a church. Why? Because people are broken and in need of a Savior. Why do I do what I do? Because I actually believe that people can only find their

ultimate meaning and rest in this life by fully surrendering to Jesus Christ.

This is all “Vision” and “Bigger Picture” related. I confess to being caught in asking “What” we should be doing rather than constantly reminding myself of “Why” we are doing it. What should I be teaching? What do people want to hear? What programs do we need to offer to keep people? None of those is centered on the purpose of the church. When a church has been reduced to asking itself what it needs to be doing to keep people coming or even just to keep people coming

more frequently then we have lost the point of the church. The point of the church is not simply to hold services that hold people’s attention. The point of the church is to bring glory and honor to Jesus Christ and fearlessly declare freedom through Jesus Christ to a world searching for meaning in one dead end pursuit after another.

I would challenge you to begin to ask yourself *why* you do the things you do. It might change everything about you. Risky, but worth it.
